## **Issues & Actions (in red):**

#### Roads

**Future Chippenham** – WC putting a revised plan to Homes England, for Southern portion of distributor road and 3800-4200 houses. New group 'Save Chippenham' forming. Contact is: <a href="mailto:helen.stride@transitionalspace.co.uk">helen.stride@transitionalspace.co.uk</a>. AN helping with potential legal challenge. County farms given notice to quit and masterplan to be progressed. Still predetermining Local Plan Review process, and inflating housing numbers.

**Melksham** (SM updated from local perspective) – most 'land-hungry' of all routes now WC 'preferred option', with most infrastructure needed. Lots of local councilors opposed so hope of support for challenge. Do need to address haulage / throughtraffic issues.

**Stonehenge Tunnel** (KF from Stonehenge Alliance gave update). DCO quashed legally. Judge found Shapps' decision 'irrational'. Scheme to be redetermined. KF shared <a href="this blog">this blog</a> which 'says everything on failures in planning and how WC handle things'. Local community being used cynically, and investments made/promised split stakeholder groups. The CEEs must now unite people against.

#### **Decarbonisation**

KF shared key messages from a recent webinar by Prof Phil Goodwin & others (Recording link: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=AYFMHEQQJv0).

Underlines absolute urgency of decarbonizing transport, emphasis on roads. Next 5 years otherwise too late. Roads still treated as exempt/ring-fenced - cumulative effect of Councils each building a few = business-as-usual.

Cycling needs massive upshift to be at all effective in reducing carbon: Ageing population - need to feel safe - e-bikes / more wheels help, and need space! Bridleways upgrades - already off road, rural network (safe), not as difficult/expensive as road schemes.

DfT's Decarbonisation plan & 'Jet Zero' aviation consultation (both linked <u>from our website here</u>) – 'all carrots and no sticks'. Sticks needed! (higher parking charges, traffic calming, CAZs through communities).

What can WCA TTG do to urgently drive home main messages to WC? Suggestion - Public opinion survey (dropped through doors but requesting online response) with agreed central and local questions. May need experienced input. AN – WCA surveyed all council candidates but Cons didn't take part. Need to ask for elected Cons responses now – e.g. 'Should Councilors take a one-day course on Climate?' – can then use as leverage for educating.

New cabinet members with greatest responsibility seem just as unconvinced. Need to involve MPs – 'Code red' urgency /aspirations for COP / addressing gulfs on policy, practice, messaging at all levels.

### **Area Boards**

AN to deliver a Transport-specific presentation to next BoA Area Board. KF commented on balance – antagonism to local schemes but offer alternative models – Cornwall aspirations as example (as rural county).

All (please) - enquire with local ABs about TTG (AN with others) presenting on transport at an Autumn meeting. Just need to liaise to arrange, and have a quick Zoom pre-meeting to discuss local issues.
